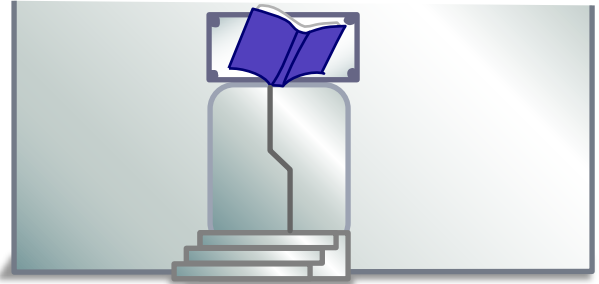
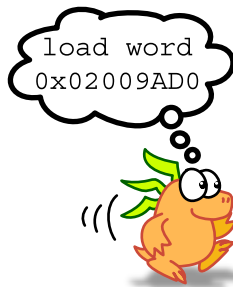
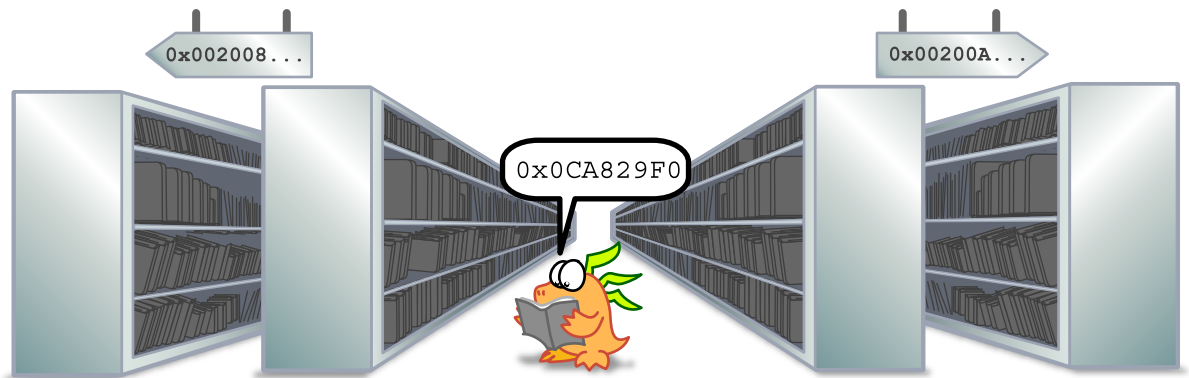


# Caches: What Are They For?

For computers, memory accesses are like going to the library,



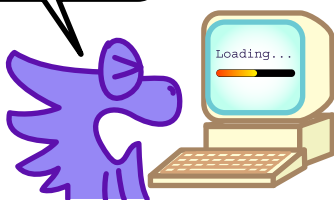
Finding the necessary information in the page of a book,



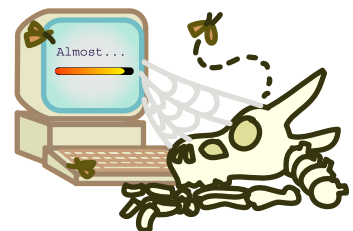
And going back home to do the work involving that information.
